



Survey of perceptions on technology in Education

A small student survey was conducted:

23 participants

one class of third year students @ Hong Kong Polytechnic University

A focus group of language instructors was conducted:

12 participants

ELC Instructors @ Hong Kong Polytechnic University

Survey Design (preliminary investigation)

Simple dichotomous questions: only one answer is possible (5 questions)

Yes-no question

Choice question ('this' or 'that')

Written answers (2 questions)

All questions were mandatory










Do you believe that technology (computer, mobile, internet...) has helped you within formal education contexts (university, secondary school...) to develop your English language ability?



Do you believe that technology (computer, mobile, internet...) has helped you develop your English language ability outside of formal education contexts (informal use of technology)?




Which has had greater influence on developing your English language ability, technology within formal education contexts OR informal use of technology?



- Use multimedia resources to enhance content and engage student interest
- Link materials to a web of resources for richer levels of input
- Integrate social media into communications where appropriate and effective
- Develop visually rich and engaging course materials
- Adopt innovative methods for delivering course materials

Some cautionary thoughts from the focus group:

- Balance the use of technology with the inclusion of technology-free lessons
- Incorporate technology when it has clear benefits
- Ensure meaningful use of technology

 - Reading, listening, watching...

- Some use of apps / interactive websites
